



e-MDs Doctor is Kansas' First Physician to be Federally Certified for Meaningful

Dr. Jen Brull, a family medicine physician in her ninth year of rural private practice became the first physician in Kansas and one of the first in the nation to be federally certified for Meaningful Use of electronic health records and has received a full incentive payment. Recognition of achieving Meaningful Use of EHRs by the federal Office of the National Coordinator (ONC) of Health Information Technology qualifies Dr. Brull for the first year Medicare Meaningful Use incentive payment of \$18,000 and up to \$44,000 in Medicare based incentives over five years.

In order to qualify for Meaningful Use incentives in 2011, physicians will need to have their EHR implemented and attested by CMS prior to October 1, 2011.
